The expansion includes new stills, fermentation tanks, bottling facilities, and warehouses. This growth allows Bardstown Bourbon to support its own brands and contract distilling partners. This addition to the city's growing bourbon scene highlights the distillery's rich history and commitment to sharing the spirit of Kentucky.

**Henderson Distilling Co. to open in downtown Henderson –** In September 2024, state and local officials broke ground on a new bourbon distillery in downtown Henderson. Henderson Distilling owners plan to rehabilitate the former Henderson Municipal Power & Light campus in downtown Henderson as part of this project, revitalizing two longstanding facilities in the community. They also will construct a new building on the campus, with barrels stored in a renovated building on the property and a visitor center located in a 7,000-s.f. structure facing Main Street. The operation will include a full-production distillery, tourism and retail space, and is expected to open in early 2025.

Augusta Distillery nears completion on new distillery – Augusta Distillery in Bracken County has nearly completed the renovation of an existing 45,000-square-foot-building, formerly home to the F.A. Neider Co. in Augusta. The company has spent more than \$45 million to build a state-of-the-art distillery, guest experience and event center in downtown Augusta. **Garrard County Distilling Co. fills first barrels in new facility –** For the first time since the 1800s, Garrard County is producing bourbon. As of January 2024, Garrard County Distilling filled its first barrels in its new facility that is just beginning of a \$250 million project. GCD, which is owned by Atlanta based spirits producer Staghorn, sits on a 210-acre site that will be home to 50,000-square-foot distillery and two rickhouses, with plans for up to 24 aging warehouses by 2030. A visitor center with a tasting room and restaurant is scheduled to open by the end of 2024.
