The museum, located in the Bierbower House, is a documented safe house that contains hidden slave chambers. Renovations at Keeneland are underway - Keeneland racetrack is undergoing a major \$93 million expansion project, the largest in its history. Construction began in January 2024 and is expected to be completed by September 2025. The project includes a new Paddock Building with dining, bar concepts, and a rooftop area, as well as improved saddling stalls. The Lodge, which was built in 1965 received upgrades to its rooms, lobby, giftshop and restaurant.
